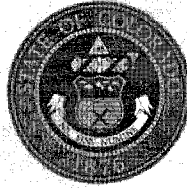


Honorary Proclamation

COLORADO DAY OF PRAYER April 26, 2008

WHEREAS, each citizen has the freedom to gather, the freedom to worship, and the freedom to pray, whether in public or private; and

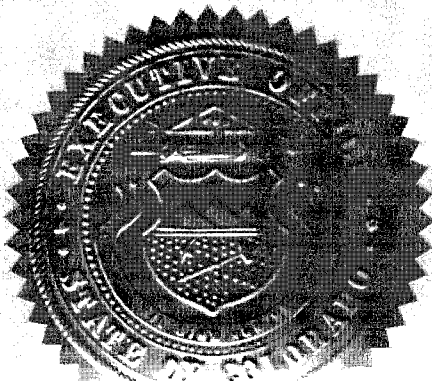
